## **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Assembly Bill (AB 130) was signed by the Governor and became effective July 9, 2021. Provisions of the bill create new options for credential candidates to meet Basic Skills (BSR). Please review the BSR information for all options. If you choose coursework or combination of coursework and exams, please complete this form and submit to the <u>Credentials Office</u> for review. Please list courses that will meet proficiency requirements. To expedite the process, please first search for courses that you completed in the ENGLISH and MATH Departments. Courses submitted from other departments might not qualify, and can delay the approval process. Attach unofficial transcript and/or exam as appropriate in PDF format. Please allow 4-6 weeks for processing. Note: Priority is given to current credential candidates.

Courses must meet the following criteria:

- > Taken at a regionally accredited college or university
- Be at least 3 semester units (or equivalent quarter units)
- > Taken for academic credit (earned units)
- Passed with B-or better
- ➤ Be degree applicable (AA coursework included)

Candidates that are satisfying BSR through passage of an exam(s) will be required to submit an official copy (PDF) of the exam. Candidates that are planning to meet BSR through passage of SAT, ACT or AP exams should contact the Credentials Office regarding these exams. Official PDFs of these exams are difficult to obtain and it is our recommendation that you first try to satisfy BSR through another method.
